POLLING DAY

As previously publicised, we have been informed by Braintree District Council that Holy Trinity will be used as a Polling Station (and therefore closed as the site can not be secured) for the approaching local elections on Thursday 4th May 2023.

I know that this additional closure day is frustrating for working parents, but we do not have a choice – each ward in the area must provide a polling station and our school is the only public building in the Trinity Ward.

HOME/ONLINE LEARNING

We have been advised to provide online learning when the school is closed for polling day. This will follow a similar format to the sessions offered when the school was closed due to heavy snow. Work for polling day will be sent home with pupils on Wednesday, and Google Meet will be used to facilitate an online session for each class.

USING GOOGLE MEET

- On an Android or iOS device you can download the Google Meet app, sign in with your child's Tabecat account, and enter the class code at the appropriate time.
- Due to platform issues it is sadly not easy to install Google Meet on Amazon Fire or Huawei devices.








ENGINEER VISIT

CORONATION EVENTS


We will be marking the coronation of King Charles III in a number of ways. Next week in English we will we writing short one-off pieces related to Kings and Queens.
