#### **CHROMEBOOKS**



A quick note here to make sure you all know how Chromebooks can be used by your children using their school accounts.

For those of you not sure what a Chromebook is, it's a laptop which runs Google's Chrome Operating system rather than Microsoft's Windows or Apple's macOS. Essentially a laptop running Google Chrome browser and nothing else, this means:

Good - They are usually cheaper, faster, and with better battery life than Windows or macOS devices.

Bad - They only run web-based applications. (Although all our school software is web-based, so if using it as a 'learning' device that's OK.)

Your child's Tabecat email (username@tabecat.com) is a Google-based account and can be used to login to any Chromebook.

If you have a Chromebook which you use with your own GMail account your child can login as another user by using their username@tabecat.com account with their usual password. This will automatically provide them with ad-blocking extensions and filtered searches, and default to the <a href="https://www.tabecat.com">www.tabecat.com</a> links page when they open Chrome.

Although not as secure and safe as at school, as we have professional filtering software, it is a safer option than 'piggybacking' on an adult's account.

Children should always be supervised when using a laptop or tablet as no system in 100% safe. We advise the children:

OK - Only use apps and websites you know are safe for you. OFF - If anything online worries you turn the screen off.

TELL - Show a trusted adult that is worrying you immediately.


