Dear Parents and Carers.

As part of our Create Curriculum term, every class has been undertaking a global citizenship project linked to Art. The intention is for children to build confidence to discuss social action for change in the world, being courageous advocats. These lessons have given children opportunities to speak out against injustice or issues that affect them and their world. This idea is linked to the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child which is part of the Rights Respecting Schools Programme. After all, our children are the voices for the future and we encourage them to be determined and aspirational!

Some themes have included deforestation, improving recycling logos, provision for sport opportunities for all children and water sanitation in countries around the world. This has included quality persuasive writing and debate around global issues that they feel strongly about. Hammerhead Class chose Article 24 (Health & Health Services) with a focus on: "Every child has the right to the best possible health...clean water...and a clean environment..." To put this into concrete action they will be trying to raise £80 to 'Pair-a-Privy' for the charity 'Money For Madagascar'. The money will provide a life-saving single toilet cubicle, a 'tippy tap' hand washing solution, and hygiene education for children who currently have no access to toilets and clean water whilst they are at school.

The project is going to culminate in some sculptures that we will exhibit outside the hall before and after the last Wow assembly on Monday 17th July. Please see above that the existing school Christian vision which has been made easier for children to read and understand.

We are really looking forward to all the exciting events coming up to mark the end of another academic school year . I really hope that we will see as many of you as possible supporting the events to make them memorable for the children, especially our Year 6 Leavers. Have a fabulous weekend



Y6 COMPUTING

micro:bit





Last week in Computing Year 6 experimented with, and programmed, Micro:Bits. These are tiny, complete computers which have a display of of 25 LEDs. After getting to grips with how they worked the children used them to create pedometers. These were tested and improved by moving around the playground in different ways and with the device held in different places, and then adjusting the code based on their findings. The class decided that in a sock, and with the 3G sensor setting, was most accurate.
