REMINDER: CHANGE TO SCHOOL HOURS FROM SEPTEMBER 2023

The expectation is that state-funded mainstream schools should deliver a school week of at least 32.5 hours by September 2023. This has meant slightly extending the school day at Holy Trinity.

Therefore, the new school hours will be arranged as follows:

Key Stage One (EY- Year 2) morning registers will close at **8.50am** and the school day will end at **3.15 pm**.

Key Stage Two (Year 3 - 6) morning registers will close at **8.50am** and the school day will end at **3.20 pm**.





HAMMERHEAD CLASS FUNDRAISING

Article 24 (Health & Health Services) of the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child states: "Every child has the right to the best possible health...clean water...and a clean environment..." As a class they wanted to do their bit to help this goal become a reality.

On Tuesday 11th July Hammerhead Class walked, ran, danced and sifaka-bounced around the daily mile track many times to raise money for school toilets, 'tippy tap' hand washing solutions and hygiene education in Madagascar.

Our aim was to raise £80 for a single toilet, but in the end we raised £250 - enough for a block of three toilets!

Thank you to all the parents, relatives and friends who sponsored us, and well done to the children for taking the cause to their hearts with such enthusiasm.

Money for Madagascar <u>www.moneyformadagascar.org</u> is helping isolated schools who struggle against the odds to give children the chance to learn. But most schools in Madagascar have no water or toilets. Thank you for helping us build new hygienic facilities for the children so we can push back against sickness and child mortality - creating safe places where children can thrive.



LADYBIRD CLASS FUNDRAISING

#In Ladybird Class have been focussing on all children having the right to an education and how we can raise awareness of this through our sculpture (which will be displayed in St Andrews Church).



COURAGEOUS VOICES AND GLOBAL CITIZENSHIP SCULPTURES



Thank you to Mrs Butterley for organising this and well done to those who have been looking after them. The sunflowers have now been moved to the bigger containers near the school office.


