Last week, each class spent the morning exploring how maths is 'all around us'. We are entering the Lord Lieutenant's Competition that has been set by Essex County Council.
















Reverend Katie would like to say how fantastic it was to see so many people attend the Christmas Service. However, a review of the congregation capacity was necessary due to health and safety regulations.

The Ash Wednesday Service for Key Stage Two pupils will be without parents / carers and is a service solely led by the church team.

Reverend Katie and I have discussed how best to organise the Easter service and have agreed to try an arrangement whereby Key Stage One have their service in school at 9.30am and Key Stage 2 have their service in church at 2pm. Both Reverend Katie and I want to have a service that first and foremost offers the best experience for the children, while being compliant with fire regulations and yet still provides the opportunities for family engagement. We will continue to review the organisation of these special services to make them as successful as possible.


